

## **LOCAL CHAPELS**

### **SAUNDERSFOOT ENGLISH WESLEYAN METHODIST CHAPEL**

*Located at the foot of the Ridgeway this chapel was built in 1892 on land leased from the Picton Estate. Previously the local Society had met in a loft above a stable. The land was leased from Picton Castle Estate for a 99 year term at an annual rent of 5d. It remains in use and in good condition in 2012.*

### **HEBRON ENGLISH BAPTIST CHAPEL**

*This attractive Baptist chapel in Church Terrace was first built in 1854 by a group of Baptists who before that time had held religious services in a cottage near to where Saundersfoot Railway Station was built. It was restored in 1881. It remains in use as a place of worship in 2012.*

### **THOMAS MEMORIAL CONGREGATIONAL CHAPEL**

*Located in High Street this chapel was first built in 1838 and known as Bethel. It was in the care of William Thomas, the Minister of Sardis chapel. It was refurbished in 1899, when its name was changed to Thomas Memorial in honour of Dr David Thomas of Stockwell, who was the son of the first minister. It remained in use as a place of worship until 2012.*

### **BETHANY CALVINISTIC METHODIST CHAPEL**

*This former Calvinistic Methodist chapel was opened in 1868 but closed and converted into flats by the Local Authority by 1970. Much of its historic character was lost in the conversion. It was a daughter chapel of Bethesda, Sandy Hill and was founded by the Rev. George Bancroft, Minister of Bethesda.*

### **CATHOLIC CHURCH**

*This Catholic Church, located on the Ridgeway, is dedicated to St. Bride and was built in 1966 and remains in use in 2012.*
